## Township Grants In The News



The Riverside-Brookfield Landmark newspaper recently featured Riverside Township and some of the financial grants that the Township Board has awarded this past year, namely to the Riverside Public Library and Riverside Brookfield High School.

The grant the Township awarded to the Library this past August will go towards digitizing 20 years worth of their newspaper archives, converting microfilm into a digital, searchable database online. The other grant highlighted in the news was awarded to RB High School back in May of this year and will go towards the purchase of additional security cameras and a portable vape detector, both part of a larger security systems upgrade the school has planned. # Delay In Property Tax Bills

Second installment property tax bills that are usually due by August 1st are delayed for the second year in a row. The Cook County Assessor's office has been implementing information technology changes over the last few years that has caused numerous delays in the Cook County property tax cycle. The government offices involved in the property tax cycle are the Cook County Assessor, the Cook County Board of Review, the Cook County Clerk, and the Cook County Treasurer.

All 2021 assessed values in Cook County must be finalized by the Cook County Board of Review and the county Assessor's Office before the Cook County Clerk can calculate local tax rates. Once calculated, the Cook County Treasurer can then print and send tax bills to residents in order to collect payments. As of right now, 2021 assessed values have not yet been finalized and certified. In order for property tax bills to have gone out on time, all Cook County 2021 assessed values should have been certified back in April of this year.



Hopefully, Cook County taxpayers will be able to pay 2021 second installment property tax bills by December 31, 2022. Additionally, taxpayers should not expect an extension to a March 1, 2023 due date of 2022 first installment tax bills.

The 2022 appeal period with the Cook County Assessor has passed and the results of those appeals have not yet been published as of this time. Taxpayers who still believe the assessed values of their property are too high will have one more chance to file for an appeal this year with the Cook County Board of Review. Hopefully, that appeal session will open before the end of this year; however, there are no specific dates from the Board of Review at this time.

The Riverside Township Assessor, Fran Sitkiewicz, and her staff are available to provide assistance to residents who have questions and concerns regarding their property taxes. The Township Assessor's Office is open **Monday - Friday, from 9:00 am until 2:00 pm**. Residents should make sure that they are added to the Township Assessor's email and call list for future updates regarding the 2022 Board of Review appeal period. ## Mental Health Board Supports New Initiatives

on suicide and crisis prevention. Funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, a branch of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the goal is to streamline access to mental health and substance abuse crisis centers by being able to **simply dial 9-8-8 nationwide**. Similar to how one can dial 9-1-1 for emergency police and fire services, 9-8-8 is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to anyone experiencing a behavioral health emergency. Crisis calls in the Riverside Township area are followed up by Pillars Community Health, the identified local provider for residents.



This past July, the State of Illinois implemented the nationwide **988 Suicide & Crisis Lifeline**, a toll-free phone number focused on suicide and crisis prevention. Funded by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, a branch of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, the goal is to streamline access to mental health and substance abuse crisis centers by being able to **simply dial 9-8-8 nationwide**. Similar to how one can dial 9-1-1 for emergency police and fire services, 9-8-8 is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to anyone experiencing a behavioral health emergency. Crisis calls in the Riverside Township area are followed up by Pillars Community Health, the identified local provider for residents.

The Riverside Township Mental Health Board has had the development of the 9-8-8 number on its agenda since it was first announced in the spring of 2021. Numerous courses of action to prepare and support the development of this crisis care system have been taken by the Mental Health Board in the time since, most notably offering a week-long Crisis Intervention Team training course at the Town Hall for local first responders back in February of this year.

Similarly, the Mental Health Board continues to fund and partner with Riverside Brookfield High School and the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) to provide student mental wellness support through the **Support4U** cell phone texting program. Support4U is a mental health-related prevention and support resource for students in which they can text licensed mental health clinicians any time of the day for assistance. Students can text a conversation on any mental health issue from anxiety, depression, and substance use, to thoughts on suicide, and bullying. The service is anonymous and can be reached by **texting "TALK" to (844) 670-5838**.

## Paper Shredding Event In September

If you missed the Shred-A-Thon hosted earlier this year by the Township, don't worry! Another one is just around the corner. The always popular paper shredding event will be held once again on **Saturday, September 24th, from 9 am - Noon**, in the parking lot of the **Riverside Masonic Lodge at 40 Forest Avenue in Riverside**.



This **FREE** event is only for Riverside Township residents and only for personal, confidential documents. No shredding of business documents allowed. Each household will be restricted to **no more than 3 boxes of paper**, and all documents will be securely destroyed and disposed of on site by American Mobile Shredding and Recycling.

**Please note:** be sure to remove all paper clips, binder clips, and spiral binders before you bring your items. Do not bring magazines, newspapers, junk mail, or other items that belong in traditional recycling. As always, this will be a contactless, drive-up event. No need to get out of your car; place your documents in your trunk, follow the signs at the event and then simply pop the trunk. We will remove the documents from your vehicle and shred them for you.

We ask that you please **bring a non-perishable food item to donate to the Township Food Pantry as well!** The Food Pantry is always in need of donations of non-perishable, non-expired items from generous residents and groups in the community. Due to the recent rise in food prices, more individuals and families have come to rely on the Food Pantry, and this increase in demand has begun to put a strain on the Pantry's ability to provide food to those in need.
